- **Application Fee***
- **Essay(s)***

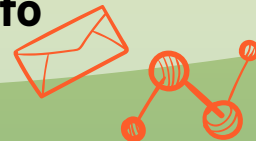

Senior College Timeline



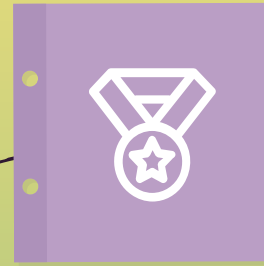

Type of Admissions



- **Regular Decision** – apply by the regular deadline; non-binding; decide by May 1st
- **Rolling Admission** – applications reviewed and a decision is rendered as soon as possible after the application is submitted; non-binding; decide by May 1st
- **Early Action** – apply early and receive a decision early, usually in December; non-binding; decide by May 1st
- **Early Decision** – apply early to one first-choice college and receive a decision early, usually in December; if accepted, the CONTRACT IS BINDING and all other applications must be rescinded.

Steps to Applying



1a. Go to the school's website

Go to admissions section and click on application for new students (applying as a freshman)

2. parchment.com

Create an account and request your transcripts to be sent to the schools of your choice

1b. Go to commonapp.org

Make an account and apply to several schools in one place
* not every school is on Common App

3. collegeboard.com

Request SAT scores to be sent to the schools of your choice *test-optional for Fall 2024

Application Opens December 1st, 2023 (Could be later)

FAFSA opens the doors for college students to get different types of financial assistance, such as grants, scholarships, work-study programs, and federal student loans.

FAFSA awards three different types of aid:

- 1. Grants & Scholarships** (financial aid that doesn't have to be repaid)
- 2. Work-study Jobs** (a part-time job where the money earned is applied towards tuition)
- 3. Loans** (financial aid that needs to be repaid, with interest)



FAFSA (Free Application for Student Aid)

Accepting the Right Amount

Students often think they have to accept the full student loan amount that they qualify for, this is not the case. After learning what they qualify for, students can choose which programs they want to enroll in or which grants they want to take. They can also choose the amount of student loan they want to accept.

Apply Early

Some grants available through FAFSA are on a first-come, first-serve basis, so applying early gives students an edge on the competition.

Student **MUST** bring their Social Security Card, or at the very least KNOW their SS# to create an account.

Michigan Achievement Scholarship



If you graduate from a MI High School and Apply for FAFSA (+EFA less than \$25,000), the State of Michigan will Pay:

- **\$2,750** per year
@ Community College
- **\$5,500** per year (for up to 5 yrs)
@ Public Universities
- **\$4,000** per year (for up to 5 yrs)
@ Independent Universities
- **65% of Students** will be able to go to college tuition free

MI ASSURED ACCEPTANCE

The following 10 Public Universities in MI announced last month that they **guarantee admission** to all in-state students with a high school grade point average of 3.0 or higher

1. Central Michigan University
2. Eastern Michigan University
3. Ferris State University
4. Lake Superior State University
5. Northern Michigan University
6. Oakland University
7. Saginaw Valley State University
8. University of Michigan-Dearborn
9. University of Michigan-Flint
10. Wayne State University

College Visitation Days
